There is no way for a Christian to be close to the Savior and not be recognized as someone sharing in the joy of His resurrection. Nobody else in the mankind's history, has been able to defeat death. In the Gospel of Luke we are told how two disciples having to walk a distance of about 7 miles out of Jerusalem, met a fellow-traveler. They did not recognize this "stranger" who told them, "you walk and are sad." (Luke 24:17) Eventually, when reaching their destination, they had a revelation: this was the resurrected Jesus. They cancelled their further journey, returned on the spot to Jerusalem, to find the other disciples whom the Gospel describes being beyond belief, full of "joy and marvel!" (Luke 24:41) This happened exactly how Jesus had foretold: "your sorrow shall be turned into joy." (John 16:20)

Russian Christians Helped with Your Gifts!



One of the pages of the newsletter of the unregistered Baptists in the former Soviet Union, printed and circulated surreptitiously. In spite of terrible persecution from the KGB (Soviet secret police) these circulars appeared without major interruption from the late 1960s up until 1987. The magazine kept up publishing names and addresses of imprisoned Baptists. Their heavy communist prison sentences were indicated under each picture. It was calculated that if all the sentences of only Baptists believers, arrested for their Christian faith, in the former Soviet Union, had been added up, the total of these prison sentences would have amounted to more than 5,000 years of prison. The editors of this magazine titled "Bulletin", promised not to come for at least 6 months out of the secret home where these were printed and multiplied.

Circled above, the picture of brother Fedor Akimovich POIUNOV, now 80, one of the Christians we could locate and help (see his testimony on next page!) At time of arrest he was 30 years old and ended up being sentenced twice, making because of his Christian faith, 7 years of hard labor. We try and help hundreds of such persecuted believers. Christian Helped with Your Gifts, 7 Years Prison for his Faith! Brother Fedor Akimovich POIUNOV writes:

Beloved sisters and brethren laboring together in the Gospel field, greetings! I thank the Lord who inspired you to undertake such work. The communist persecution of believers inside the former

Soviet Union intensified in the 1960s, especially in my city (named) Omsk, Russia.

The majority of the churches did not accept the new communist laws governing all denominations. These laws were drafted specifically to liquidate once and for all Christian believers. A delegation from the Central Leadership of the Baptist Denomination in Moscow, came to our church in Omsk, urging us to accept the communist government authority as expressed in these laws. We tried arguing with them, proving how these laws interfered with our faith. We explained we cannot subject ourselves to such atheistic laws. The church ended up split. Most believers, ministers, elders who opposed these communist laws were arrested and sentenced to long prison terms. We sent in 1966 representatives to the Central Committee of the Communist Party in Moscow (intending our opposition to be peaceful. A distance from Omsk of 1,700 miles or 35 hours by train.) We forwarded complaints and petitions regarding the persecution of our churches. What followed, was an even more intensified persecution of all believers on the part of the communist authorities. First arrested were our minister Kozorezov (see in previous page, red arrow) and two believers-sisters. Then they arrested the ministers Nicolai Romanovich and Peter Popov. In November 1967 myself ended up arrested as well. The prison conditions were atrocious. We lacked any proper food. I completed the first prison-term having been sentenced at first to a two years of prison-time and when I had served this prison-term I was again arrested and sentenced to five additional years of communist jail. The communist authorities tried to urge me to a compromise. Thus after 3½ years I was offered freedom if I accepted these communist anti-Christian laws. I did not vield and therefore I continued being kept in prison.

I thank the Lord for sustaining us during all this time we were in the communist jails. We witnessed His (Protecting) Hand on us. God Bless!

Brother Petru Vasile SMETANIUK writes: "I was called to the ministry and was ordained as a pastor in the year 1962. Few Christians at the time dared openly lead a church. Many were scared that if true to their Christian calling, they would be arrested and sentenced to heavy years of communist prison. I accepted this calling and inmersed myself fully in God's work. Due to my uncompromising stand, I ended up being arrested in August 1971 and sentenced to three years of communist prison. My prison time was difficult being subjected to hard labor. I did forced labor in a foundry. Food was sparse. This prison held over 1,200 inmates. I also worked in the prison mess. Prisoners asked for food and I had none to give. I ended up being personally threatened. The communist authorities asked me to compromise my faith and collaborate with them by betraying other believers. Somehow I kept a Bible but it was discovered upon a thorough search and the communist authorities punished me drastically. For six months, I could not receive any menial food-packages from my family. Once freed from the communist prisons, I restarted ministering to underground church meetings. This is a short description of the difficult life of believers in the communist Soviet system. Am now residing in the Chernivtsi County, Ukraine. My thanks to God. We never lacked His protection. God bless you with His peace."

Two Sisters, Each Got 3 Years of Communist Prison



Sidorova Vera Panteleevna writes: "I was born in 1948 and my sister Sidorova Nadejda Panteleevna in 1951. Our parents were Baptist believers, members in an unregistered church in Novokuznetsk, former Soviet Union. The church had to remain unregistered since the communist laws regarding churches were enacted on purpose to control totally religious life and destroy eventually the faith. The officially "registered" denominations were under the supervision of a so-called "Commissioner for All Religious Cults." Pastors had to report regularly to this communist, atheist commissioner. He needed approve who preached, who was supposed to be ordained, baptized or had some church activity. Unless this commissioner gave such approval, whatever the members of the church decided, was of no importance. The communist commissioner of cults forbade any religious education of children. The communist state considered such education of youngster very dangerous for the atheistic government and therefore many believers ended up imprisoned for activities with children. Together with my sister we were active in an underground printing shop. We issued the forbidden religious publication Khristianin (The Christian.) In it, were also published names, addresses, sentences and even pictures of many imprisoned believers. Also printed were tens of thousands of New Testaments. Several Christian workers, us included, ended up arrested by the KGB in 1980. While interrogated, we were offered many times to be let free if we betrayed coworkers and collaborated with the KGB. Since we refused categorically to be traitors like Judas, our sentence was the maximum term of three years prison. We were incarcerated in the city of Sverdlovsk, Siberia, Russia. At the end of the three-years prison sentence we continued our Christian activities and were not caught again. We live together as we have no other family. May God bless you richly."

Christian Helped with Your Gifts Disadvantaged Child Became a Teacher



Andrea, now 29, writes: "I work as an elementary school teacher at Richard Wurmbrand College, a Christian Elementary-, Middle- and High-School in Iasi, Romania. This is the same school where I had also studied for 8 years.

I come from a big family – there are 11 of us, 7 boys and 4 girls. When growing up, it was difficult for my parents provide for us. At the end of 4th grade, one of my friends challenged me to try to enroll for the entrance exam at the Richard Wurmbrand College. By God's grace I passed the exam and what followed was one of the most wonderful periods of my life. The years I spent studying went by quickly, almost too quickly, but looking back I have dear memories of teachers investing in me. I am what I am today because of the people who modelled character for me - my teachers helped me develop and gain trust in myself and in God. They were fully aware I came from a big family and our financial possibilities were limited to say the least, but I never felt discriminated or set aside because of our poor financial status. There were times when I knew my family could not afford to pay the school fee and we felt blessed when the headmaster allowed us to come help with the summer cleaning and redecorating. This way, we could pay in work what we could not afford to pay with money.

More than that, when my youngest sister enrolled in the school, we were helped by wonderful people whom we do not know, people we never met offering to sponsor us throughout school. What a lesson in Christian generosity! At the end of my studies, the same friend who had challenged me to enroll in the school, encouraged me to apply for a job as a teacher at the Richard Wurmbrand College. Thank you all donors!"
